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Existential-humanistic and existential-integrative therapies

I will speak briefly about the unmet need of increased clinical training in existential therapy, particularly in the U.S.

This is especially problematic in light of the recent success of institutions such as Michigan School of Professional Psychology, Point Park University and the Existential-Humanistic Institute as well as the APA publishing program which has recently produced two major existential texts and a forthcoming third edition of another text. I also will touch on the related need of existential therapy and therapists to step out of our comfort zones and apply our perspective to the variety of social issues (e.g., political divisiveness, lack of affordable in depth therapy) that plague the U.S. and world.
